CAF: (MEDIA) Royal Canadian Navy ship completes Northwest Passage journey for first time since 1954. "It was the longest time a Canadian navy ship has operated in the Arctic in consecutive days in more than 50 years," said Cmdr. Corey Gleason, commanding officer of HMCS Harry DeWolf. he ship began its voyage in Iqaluit on Aug. 7 and is sailing to its final destination in Vancouver, where it's expected to arrive on Friday.

North Korea: (MEDIA) North Korea said Friday it test-fired a new anti-aircraft missile, the fourth weapons launch in recent weeks that experts say is part of a strategy to win relief from sanctions and other concessions. South Korea, Japan and the United States typically publicly confirm North Korean ballistic missile launches, which are banned by U.N. resolutions, soon after they occur. But they did not do so for Thursday's, indicating the weapon tested may have been a different kind. Seoul's Joint Chiefs of Staff said Friday that South Korean and U.S. intelligence authorities monitored moves by North Korea but didn't elaborate.

Ethiopia: (DIPLO) At approximately 10am EDT, the Ethiopian government announced the expulsion of seven UN officials from UNICEF, the UN High Commission for Human Rights, and OCHA, including the Canadian Head of Ethiopia's OCHA office. They have been accused of "meddling in internal affairs" and have 72 hours to leave the country.

HUAWEI: (MEDIA) Huawei said on Friday it had filed an appeal against a ruling by a Swedish court in June that upheld a ban on the Chinese company for selling 5G equipment in the country.

The company said it had requested an oral hearing in the case, but the Court of Appeal could decide if such a hearing should be held or a preliminary ruling from the European Court of Justice should be requested. Huawei had earlier said it would consider all options, including an appeal.

- CAF (MEDIA): Rory Fowler, a lawyer acting for Adm. McDonald, said his client was told of his termination after the Prime Minister's Office released a statement announcing Gen. Eyre's appointment. Adm. McDonald's next step will be to resign from the military, Mr. Fowler added, adding that his client has had a "rough nine months."
- 5G (MEDIA): Both Bell and Telus have approached the federal government over the possibility of being compensated by taxpayers, should they have to remove Huawei equipment from their networks, sources have told National Post. The two companies could find themselves forced to replace the equipment if the Liberals bans the Chinese telecom equipment-maker from 5G networks. The Liberal government has been mulling the ban for three years over security concerns. With uncertainty over government plans, Canadian wireless providers have been building their 5G networks using equipment from other vendors. But both Bell and Telus

- have previously installed Huawei equipment to serve their existing older-generation networks. That equipment would have to be removed if the ban is retroactive.
- Ukraine (MEDIA): CNN Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said Friday that a group of Ukrainians and
  Russians was planning a coup against him at the beginning of December. The Kremlin rejected Zelensky's claim
  that Russia is involved in plotting a coup in Ukraine. "Russia never had any plans to take part. In general, Russia
  is never engaged in that kind of thing," Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said on a conference call with
  journalists Friday.
